Engagement with Ballymore and BAML

- Increased frequency of meeting with Dan Cross, resort director
- Direct contact with Gordon Whelan and James Watson from finance
- Established regular meeting with Aftercare
- Established regular meeting with Managing Director, BAML
- Established dialogue with Director of Construction, Ballymore



Engagement with Ballymore and BAML

- Information on building works
- Security procedures
- Briefing plus email and written information re fire safety
- More regular information on empty units (Sainsbury's !!!)
- Achieved more frequent & better expressed comms to residents



Buildings and apartments issues

- Advocated for groups of residents with common issues
- Lift repairs, lift vandalism, repairs to common areas of buildings
- Secure door of car park
- Supported on cooker hoods, wooden floors, LED lighting, water leaks
- Consistently advocating on slow repairs incl door entry, corridor lighting



Buildings and apartments issues

- Applied pressure re intercom failures
- Applied pressure to get window cleaning done in lockdown
- Complaints re balcony design
- Regular reminders re cigarette disposal



- Our suggestions for management of the car park were adopted
- Illegal parking no consistent progress
- Proposed an approach to use of common areas



- Organised litter picking groups
- Supported residents in trying to get a post box approved but not here
- Secured resident input into films chosen for the Picture House
- Advocated regarding issues with the gym and booking system



- Represented residents with regard to traffic management
- Organised fact-find meeting with Technology Institute
- Persistently reminded Ballymore re unfinished pool fencing
- Pressed for Ballymore to fix pontoon planks
- Got more bins installed (including recycling) for common areas



- Requested changes to litter cleaning at weekends + D3 area
- Suggested mostly-empty disabled spaces become also parent/child
- Applied consistent pressure around security performance
- Pressed on action against drug dealing
- Advocated on security risks such as non-closing doors



- Got action on lack of lighting on Lyell Street
- Suggested private garden area for LCI residents under consideration
- Social activities social cinema nights, summer BBQ
- Very successful bake sales raised £2700 for charities
- Secured a storage area for LRA



- Included in planning for community centre
- Ran survey to get residents' views on use of community centre
- Helped many individuals with queries and problems



Local area and developments

- Highlighted to residents plans for Orchard Wharf
- Produced printed information leaflet & distributed
- Raised almost £8000 and appointed specialists to represent us to Planning
- Engaged with local politicians
- Put pressure on council regarding permanent camp near blue bridge



Contact with other Ballymore developments

- Supported and attended initial meeting of Ballymore RAs
- Working with other Chairs on how to represent together on common issues and interests



Not all plain sailing

- It's not been easy getting action from Ballymore
- Some Ballymore actions have caused extra problems
- Many extra problems due to lockdown management
- Difficult to keep up communications with residents



Not all plain sailing

- Lots of new residents coming in as buildings opened
- Committee members have many other commitments
- Unrealistic expectations of some residents
- Lack of understanding that email is the primary way to raise issues with us
- Persistent, brutal personal trolling & unfounded accusations/criticism



Going forward

- Some changes on the committee
- Reduction of committee meetings from 6 to 4 per year
- Single meeting attended by different elements of Ballymore plus reduced nu
- Continued liaison with other LRA chairs

Finance report

- All funds received were from GoFundMe for Orchard Wharf campaign (£779)
- Payments to consultants £3420 and £1500 (air quality and traffic)
- £2783.32 left in bank account
- Payment still due to planning consultant
- No bank activity since April



Service charge report - Nick Thompson



Service charge report

- Enormous amount of chasing of accounts information
- Change of personnel at BAML brought some progress early 2021
- 2019 accounts now available / 2020 account expected September
- Appointment of a consultant to examine charges non-productive
- Access being arranged to invoices for SC inspection over summer



Service charge report

- Overall surplus declared for 2019
- LRA secured early return of monies versus BAML proposal of end 2021
- 2020 existence of surplus has been verbally confirmed to us
- Furlough savings will be declared with 2021 service charge demands
- Detailed analysis of 2021 budget by LRA



Service charge report

- Many queries about communal energy charges
- Open meeting arranged with Communal Energy Partners
- Video of that Zoom call available online
- Question recently put to BAML regarding the scheme to reduce energy chargestelling excess to the grid response awaited





- RA must have a chair, treasurer and secretary to function
- Only leaseholders are allowed to vote in elections
- Voting will be done via a Zoom poll
- Where more than one candidate is in the frame, each will give information on what they will bring
